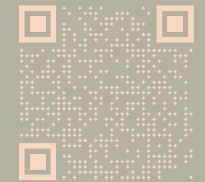
**About *New Middles***

## Exhibit Columbus Map

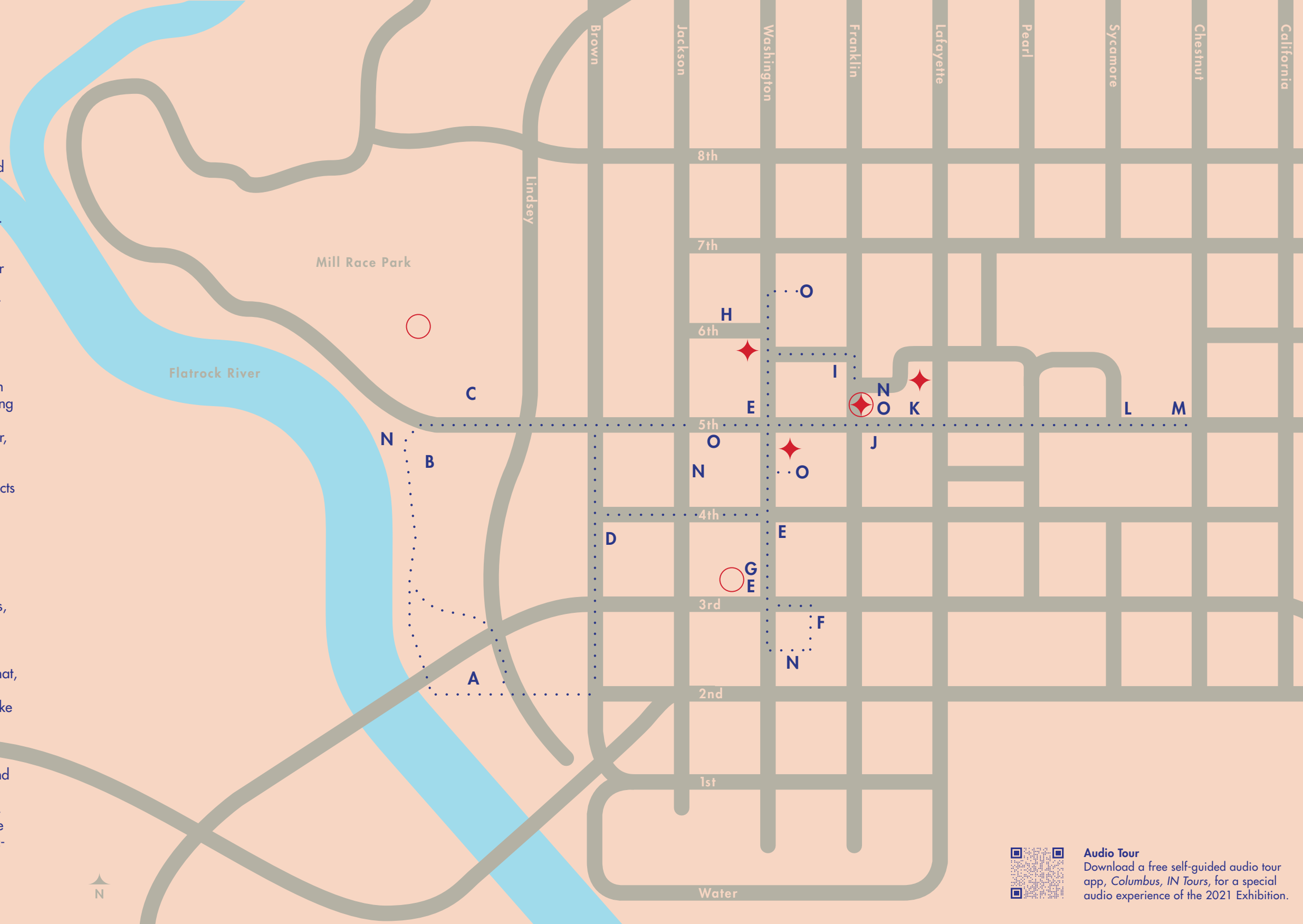
Thank you for coming to Exhibit Columbus. We invite you to use this map to explore downtown and the installations in the 2021 Exhibition.

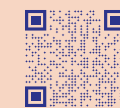
